Activity Report 2013

On behalf of all Trustees and the Chair of SHIP we would like to thank you for your continuous support enabling us, once again, to tend to our projects by assisting the poor and vulnerable at Shewula. Following is a short summary of the 2013 activities. Some of the projects were ongoing others had to be reduced, due to lack of funding, and some could be concluded as they became self sustainable. We have many new demands which we intend to address in future.

We are still concentrating on distributing clothing and food. Thanks to generous donations, over 800kg of clothing was distributed to the wider community. Every sub region (14) received an equal part. The distribution was supervised by the Chief and his elders personally, to be transparent. A further consignment is ready and we are now actively seeking financial support for the next shipment.

Supporting schools with books, pencils, rubbers, sharpeners, paper etc is still ongoing and much appreciated. School fees, uniforms and shoes for pupils have also been covered by SHIP





To pay for ploughing by tractor has proved very successful - not only did it support the widows and their children; they were also able to sell some crop, deriving an income for them. Some even joined us and donated a part of their crop to the poor of their community. We shall extend this kind of support in the coming year.
